
# EASY CHORDS FOR TINY FINGERS



#### WHAT IS A CHORD STAMP?

A chord stamp is like a map for your guitar. It shows you exactly where to put your fingers on the strings and the frets to make music. It's super easy!


Imagine the strings on your guitar like lines on a piece of paper, running from left to right. We'll count them from left to right because that's how we usually read things. And think of the frets like steps on a ladder, starting from the top and going down


The black circle tells us which strings to place your left hand fingers on.

The empty circles above the lines tell us to play the open strings. The spots marked with an 'X tell us not to play these strings.

So, when you look at the chord stamp, find the black circles and put your fingers there. Play the 'O' strings and skip the 'X' strings. It's like magic! Keep practicing, and you'll get even better at making music with your guitar."














# THE HALF G CHORD




Your first chord is going to be a half G chord, strummed from the G string.

1. Place your 3rd finger of your left hand on the 3rd fret of the first string. If you have the Kids Guitar Dojo Fretboard markers you would see the Ghost marker on your guitar.

# THE HALF G CHORD

#### LOCKING DOKING

This is a chord stamp tilted over on its side, just like your looking down at the guitar.



















### THE HALF C CHORD



- 1. Place your 1st finger of your left hand the 1st fret of the 2nd string.
- 2. Rest your pick on the G 3rd string and gently swipe the 3 strings in a downward motion, just like you played the half G Chord.



REMEMBER TO CURL YOUR 1ST FINGER
OVER LIKE A CATS CLAW
THIS WILL HELP YOU GET RIGHT ONTO THE
TIP OF YOUR FINGER!

LOOK AT HOW THE THUMB IS PRESSING INTO THE BACK OF THE NECK. THIS HELPS YOU GET MORE PRESSURE ON THE TIP OF YOUR FIRST FINGER.






# THE D7 CHORD




- 1. Place your 1st finger of your left hand the 1st fret of the 2nd string.
- 2. Place your 2nd finger of your left hand the 2nd fret of the 3rd string.
- 3. Place your 3rd finger of your left hand the 2nd fret of the 2nd string.
- 4. Rest your pick on the D 4th string and gently swipe the 4 strings in a downward motion.
